**International Wildlife Crimestoppers Receives Grant from
Bass Pro Shops and Cabela's Outdoor Fund**

Wall of Shame trailers are traveling exhibits to educate the public about wildlife poaching and its negative effects. The exhibits create a broader awareness to the unending problem of poaching wildlife.
